
How to Apply

Pathways to success

There is always more than one way to study at Torrens University Australia. So, even if you don't meet the course requirements, you may take another pathway to reach your chosen course. For instance, you can complete a diploma and then proceed to a bachelor's degree. Then, you can proceed to a graduate certificate and graduate diploma, followed by a master's

Visa, Academic Entry and English language requirements

Visa requirements

As an international student, you can apply for a student visa once you have:

- Accepted a Torrens University Australia degree
- Organised your Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)
- Received Confirmation of Enrolment

Please refer to homeaffairs.gov.au for more details about visa options and requirements.

Online courses

International students must not enrol in more than one-third (33%) of online subjects over their course, and must study at least one face-to-face subject each trimester. Most face-to-face courses are also available online.

Please note: due to the COVID-19 pandemic, authorities have provided exceptions to the usual face-to-face learning requirements.

Students under 18

Before the Department of Home Affairs process your visa, you must have:

- An offer to study at Torrens University Australia
- Plans to travel to Australia on a student visa
- Formal arrangements in place for accommodation and welfare

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

It is a student visa condition that you have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your stay in Australia. OSHC will contribute towards any medical and hospital expenses you may incur.

Academic entry requirements

To study a degree at Torrens University Australia, you must meet specific criteria for your course, such as minimum entry scores and English language requirements.

We recognise qualifications from other countries and education systems, such as GCE A-Levels, International Baccalaureate and SAT. We also assess students who have completed Australian equivalent qualifications.

If you don't meet the entry requirements for direct admission into our courses, you can apply for a pathway program.

Students who have partially completed a degree can apply for direct admission with a credit transfer. You may see this referred to as "advanced standing", "exemptions" or "recognition of prior learning".

English language requirements

For English language students, Torrens University Language Centre (TULC) provides a pathway towards an Australian university degree. After you complete English for Academic Purposes at TULC, you can progress to a higher education course at Torrens University Australia.

What is the English requirement for my course?

Some courses may require a higher overall score and/or sub-score(s) for entry. These requirements are shown in accordance with the IELTS academic test requirements.


We also accept other English tests. Students will generally need to have achieved one of the following for entry into their chosen course:

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS) 6 with 5.5 in all areas
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) 60 with a minimum 18 in writing
- Cambridge English Scale Score 169 with 162 in all areas
- Pearson Test of English (PTE) 50 with 42 in all areas

International scholarships

Each year, Torrens University Australia offers scholarships to new international students. These are awarded based on academic performance and a person's drive to achieve their dream career.

We often launch brand-new courses where all new international students receive automatic scholarships.






